Jean-Jacques Barbéris is Deputy Head of the Financial Markets Division at the French Treasury Directorate General.

He is notably in charge of negotiating the European regulation on derivatives and market infrastructures (EMIR), the European regulation on short selling and credit default swaps, the regulation of Central Securities Depositories, the Securities Law Directive and the revision of the market abuse directive.

Jean-Jacques is also responsible for the development of market and post-market infrastructures in Paris, the animation of the Place de Paris and the relationships between the Treasury and the French Financial Services Authority.

He was appointed Deputy Head of the Financial Markets Division in March 2010 after serving as Deputy Head of Environment and commodities unit from 2008 to 2010 where he was in charge of developing regulations in the fields of commodities and CO₂ market and international financing negotiations.
